

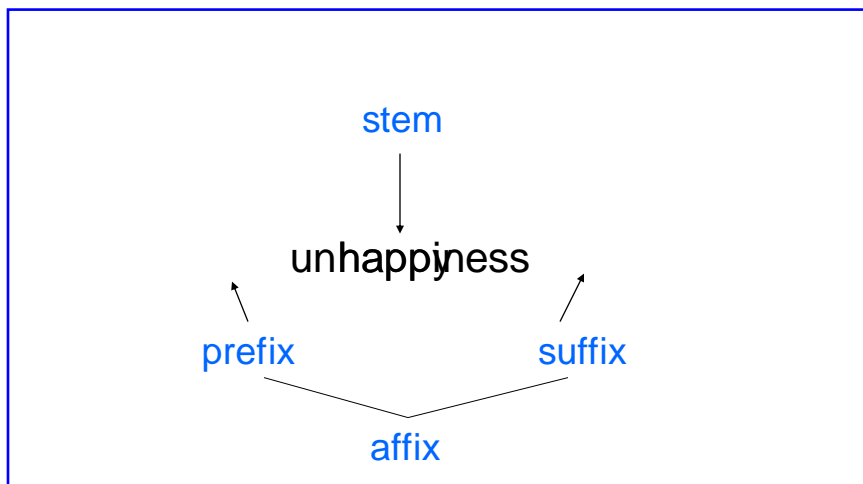

Word Composition





Definition

In concatenative morphology, a **morpheme** is the **smallest semantically meaningful unit** of a language.

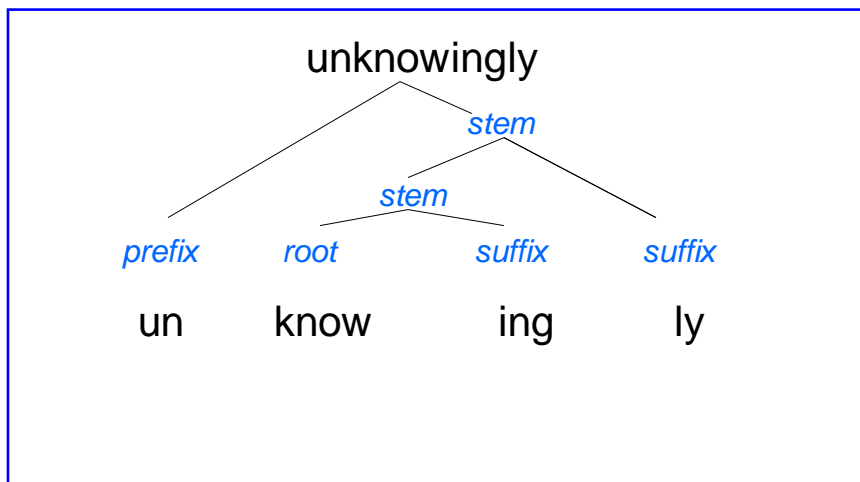
e.g. *un-* = negation
 -ness = nominal form
 happy = 😊

Assumption: words can be decomposed
(=concatenative).

Free Morpheme

Some morphemes are standalone words.

E.g. *happy, joy, purple, possible, ...*

Free morphemes can function as standalone words.

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Bound Morpheme

Morphemes that are not words in themselves, and must be attached to another morpheme are called **bound morphemes**

E.g. *un-, re-, -ness, -ment, ...*

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Non-Concatenative Cases

Breaking a word up into morphemes is not always easy/feasible.

e.g.

feet = foot + plural ?

sang = sing + past tense?
