There's something special about the piece "establish". It is the smallest unit in the entire word that provides the core meaning. This the ROOT.








Compositionality

Root and Stem

Root

In concatenative morphology, the root is the unit that provides the core meaning and to which affixes may be attached.

Stem


In concatenative morphology, the stem is the unit to which affixes are attached.







Example



Note: Theatre and ultimate here are also stems, since all roots are potential stems.







Root with Infix

Tagalog
sulat "write"
sumulat "to write"

Sulat

um

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Free or bound

Not all roots and stems are free morphemes

E.g. *geography*geo + graphy
